

PSHE education at James Brindley is a subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe, and prepare for life and work in modern Britain. Evidence shows that well-delivered PSHE programmes have an impact on both academic and non-academic outcomes for pupils, particularly the most vulnerable and disadvantaged.

At James Brindley PSHE education aims to develop skills such as resilience, self-esteem, risk-management, team work and critical thinking in the context of learning grouped into three core themes: health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world (including economic wellbeing and aspects of careers education).

The national curriculum also states that 'all schools should make provision for personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE), drawing on good practice'. PSHE education is contributes to schools' statutory duties outlined in the Education Act 2002 and the Academies Act 2010 to provide a balanced and broadly-based curriculum and is essential to Ofsted judgements in relation to personal development, behaviour, welfare and safeguarding.

PSHE does cover a diverse range of topics including sensitives but essential topics such as domestic violence, in the majority of James Brindley settings PSHE is delivered by the pupils form tutors and as they know our pupils the best if the topic is not suitable either for the whole class or an individual they can not attend those sessions. If you feel there is a topic that your child should not undertake please speak to their Centre Leader.

To support your child in PSHE please help them complete all the homework that is set. If your child is in Year 10 or Year 11 they will be completing the AQA Award/Certificate in PSHE. If a pupil completes four units they will gain the Award at either entry level 1-3 or level 1 or level 2, if they complete 7 units they gain the Certificate which again is levelled at entry level 1-3 or level 1 and level 2. PSHE has many links with topics that regularly appear in the news such as migration, 'Brexit' and eating your 5 a day. It is always helpful for pupils to hear a wide range of opinions in order to create and shape their own views—talking about news stories with another adult/family member is an excellent way of supporting your child to develop such deeper thinking skills.
